# **Devotional**

#### **Devotional**

# **Devotional**

# **Devotional**

### **Devotional**

When you see a cake, what do you think of? A birthday? A holiday party? A celebration for the end of a sports season or the last day of school? We seem to link cake to happy moments in our lives. God wants us to always be joyful. That's tough some days. I think that's why the next part of this verse is important. Praying constantly is the only way we can keep a joyful attitude. ## Devotional


Mom- What sports or exercise activities did you do when you were younger?

# **Picture the Moment**

Get out the mixing bowls and that wooden spoon. Bake up a loaf of homemade bread or fresh rolls for your family. Do it the old fashioned way. Sure, it might take a while, but the whole house will smell incredible.

#### Verse to Share

Your boasting is not good. Don't you know that a little yeast works through the whole batch of dough? 1 Corinthians 5:6 NIV

#### **Devotional**

Yeast is a funny ingredient. If used correctly, is gives you a light, fluffy, and delicious loaf of bread. If used incorrectly, your bread will be as hard as a rock and could be better put to use as a door stop. Yes, yeast can either make or break a good loaf of bread. God gave you the sense of humor that came up with the clever joke. You see, God is at the center of everything. If you must boast about something, brag about your Heavenly Father. And just like yeast mixes though the dough and makes bread either totally delicious or totally disgusting, you want your boasts to be helpful, not hurtful. So, if you must boast, boast in God and watch his blessing rise up all around you.

# **Devotional**

## **Verses to Share**

#### **Devotional**

Have ever guessed the movie ending before it was over. Sometimes it's fun to guess "who did it" or "what really happened". Sometimes you are right but many times the story line takes twists and turns until you can't really guess the ending until it's right upon you. That makes a good movie, but what about when it is your real life. We have twists and turns in our lives for certain. #### **Picture the Moment**

Take a picture in the movie theater lobby with popcorn in hand. Make your expression match the movie you are seeing. If it's a comedy, laugh and show off those pearly whites. If it's sad, turn your smile upside down and wipe away a tear. If it's a little of both, be creative, and add some dramatic expressions of you own.



Put on a fashion show. Look way back in the closet and pull out the clothes, jewelry, and accessories you have forgotten about. Don't forget Mom's closet, too. Pull all your fantastic findings together and come up with creative new outfits. Add a red carpeted runway, some fun music, and the flashing lights of the camera, and you have a star studded night of fun!

# **Verses to Share**

Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. Matthew 7:1-2 NIV

#### **Devotional**

Today, you can't turn on the television without seeing someone being judged. People are judged for their fashion style, dancing, athletic skill, and even their ability to perform the silliest tasks. If you are not good enough, too bad, you are kicked off, out of the show, or thrown in the mud. I guess sometimes we need judges, just like we have to have rules and laws. It would be chaos without them. However, there are some times judging is just plain wrong. Let's say you have a tendency to gossip. Read Matthew 7:1-2 again and talk about situations when judging is okay and when it is wrong.

## **Picture the Moment**

Take a picture of you and Mom in your favorite outfits. Strike a pose and add some dramatic flair. Don't worry, you won't be judged.



Bust out the make-up kit, blow dryer, and curling irons. Unleash the eye shadow colors you never dream of wearing and indulge your lips with a new hue. Be adventurous with a hairstyle or change up your old one in ways you never thought of. The fun is in the mistakes though, so let loose, and live a little.

# **Verse to Share**

I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. Psalm 139:14 NIV

#### **Devotional**

Most girls struggle with the "beauty monster" at some point in their life. What's the beauty monster you might ask? Well, the ugly creature appears when girls think, "If only I had straight hair, curly hair, blond hair, red hair (fill in the blank here with what you want rather that what you have," or "I just can't stand my nose, why does it look this way," or even, "Look at my eyebrows, they're hideous!" ### **Verse to Share**

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. 1 Corinthians 9:24 NIV

### Devotional

Whether you are running short or long distances, if you want to do it right, there's training involved. You have to stretch, practice, and prepare your body for the race ahead. The Bible compares our life to a race. We are all participants. We have a number pinned to our shirt, begin at the signal, and start to run. But in the end, only one person wins the prize. That winner takes home a massive trophy or an oversized check to prove that she has won the race. All of the other runners don't get to take a piece of the trophy home or a few dollars from the check. No, that prize only goes to the winner. The others are just labeled participants. Make a flower arrangement for the dinner table or your bedroom. You can choose wildflowers from a field, buds from the florist, or visit your local craft store and buy some blooms that will never fade. Make something lovely for your eyes to see.

### **Verse to Share**

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable- if anything is excellent or praiseworthy- think about such things. Philippians 4:8 NIV

#### Devotional

Flowers are just too pretty to keep outside. Whether you have roses, violets, or chrysanthemums, cut their stems and find that glass vase hidden in the back of the closet. Maybe you've received flowers before for a special occasion. They're great to celebrate birthdays, recitals, special programs, and just about any and every holiday. ### Devotional

He loves to hear your praises and you'll be amazed at how much it can change your own mood and attitude. You'll go from sad to glad in no time flat. And here's the best part. Other people might hear you. Songs are contagious don't you know. Spread God's love one song at a time. Start singing, Sweetie!

You can't fool them and you certainly cannot fool God. Get to know the Savior. Spending time with him will certainly sweeten up your perspective on life.
